



KRAA Key River Buoys Committee 2025-26

Purpose: To ensure safe and clear navigation in the Key River area by maintaining, monitoring, and improving the community buoy system, **while meeting all municipal and regulatory requirements.** The committee will coordinate seasonal installation, inspection, and removal, while communicating updates to all members



Objectives:

1. Safety & Compliance - Safe & Clear

- Maintain reliable markers for navigation.
- Ensure buoys meet Canadian Coast Guard standards (size, color, reflectivity).
- Clear obstacles below the waterline within navigation route
- Reduce risks for boaters, visitors, and residents.
- Provide documentation and photos verifying compliance to the Municipality of Killarney



2. Seasonal Management

- Spring: Inspect, repair, and install buoys. Audit reflector tape, chain, anchors,
- **Summer:** Monitor condition, replace reflectors, confirm locations. Submit mid-season condition notes.
- Fall: Remove buoys, clean, store, and document repairs needed for next year

3. Community Engagement

- Recruit volunteer crew for buoy placement or relocation..
- Share updates with members (location changes, hazards)
- Thank volunteers and donors who contribute equipment or funds.

4. Funding & Budget

- Maintain annual budget for Management Crew. Gas, equipment, chains, anchors, reflective tape. Accept donations for equipment upgrades or new buoy placements
- Accept donations and municipal support
- Track invoices for all buoy-related purchases/services and retain proof of payment, as required by the Municipality. (Treasurer)



Structure

- Chairperson (Carl): Oversees program, ensures compliance, reports to KRAA and Municipality.
- **Crew Leaders**: Small teams responsible for specific sections of the river.
- Volunteers: Assist with deployment, maintenance, and seasonal tasks.
- **Communications Support**: Coordinates with the KRAA Communications team to share updates.

Municipal Requirements

To receive municipal funding, the Buoy Committee will provide the following annually:

- 1. **Committee Report** Detailing seasonal activities, volunteer hours, locations maintained, and challenges.
- 2. **Invoices/Receipts** Copies of paid invoices for equipment, repairs, or purchases.
- 3. **Hold Harmless Agreement** Signed document releasing the Municipality of Killarney from liability for buoy operations
- **4. Proof of Coast Guard Compliance** Photos or certification confirming buoys meet federal standards.
- 5. **Liability Insurance** Proof of valid coverage for buoy operations.

Communications Language (Safe & Clear)

"The Key River Buoy Committee, supported by KRAA, helps organize volunteers and resources to keep navigation markers safe and visible. Buoy placement is a community-led effort — all boaters remain responsible for navigating safely and using charts as their primary guide."

Operations Calendar

Spring (May-June)

- Inspection, repairs, inventory, installation. Submit compliance photos.
- Audit and stock up on Reflector Tape Inventory, Buoys, Chain
- Inspect all buoys in storage (check floats, chains, anchors, reflective tape, paint).
- Repair or repaint as needed.
- Coordinate volunteer crews and boats for installation day.
- Place buoys at designated locations and confirm positions match navigation needs.
- Share "Buoys are in!" update with members through KRAA channels.

Summer (July-August)

- Mid-season buoy check: look for wear, fading, or movement after storms.
- Replace reflective surfaces if faded.
- Replace missing/damaged buoys where possible.
- Communicate any temporary hazard notices (sunken logs, shifted rocks, etc.).
- Thank volunteers publicly in summer newsletter/social media.



Fall (September-October)

- Organize buoy removal day with volunteers.
- Inspect, clean, and store buoys in a secure location.
- Document any repairs needed before next season.
- Share "Buoys are out" notice with members.
- Submit budget request for next year (paint, hardware, replacements).
- Submit compliance photos.

Year-Round

- Maintain updated list of buoy locations and volunteers.
- Track expenses for chains, anchors, and reflective materials.
- Coordinate with KRAA Communications to ensure timely updates to members.



Hold Harmless Agreement

BETWEEN:

The Corporation of the Municipality of Killarney (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality")

AND:

The Key River Area Association (hereinafter referred to as "KRAA")

Purpose

This agreement acknowledges that the Key River Buoy Committee, operating under KRAA, installs, maintains, and removes buoys in the Key River area as a community-led initiative. The Municipality provides financial assistance but does not assume responsibility for buoy operations.

Terms of Agreement

1 . Assumption of Responsibility

- KRAA acknowledges that it is solely responsible for the placement, maintenance, and removal of buoys.
- KRAA will ensure all buoys comply with Canadian Coast Guard standards.

2. Release of Municipality

KRAA agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Municipality of Killarney, its councillors, officers, employees, and agents from any and all claims, demands, damages, or costs arising out of buoy operations.



3. Insurance

 KRAA will maintain liability insurance covering buoy operations and will provide proof of such insurance to the Municipality annually.

4. Reporting Requirements

- KRAA agrees to provide the Municipality with:
 - a) An annual report of buoy operations.
 - b) Copies of invoices/receipts for purchases and services related to buoys.
 - c) Proof of compliance with federal standards (e.g., photos of installed buoys).

5. Acknowledgment of Boater Responsibility

 KRAA recognizes that all boaters remain individually responsible for safe navigation and for consulting official navigation charts.


